VISITORS' INFORMATION SHEET 2019

Welcome to Gorran Haven. Gorran Haven Harbour Trust (G.H.H.T) Joint Harbourmasters are Steve Williams (also the Secretary of GHHT) & Andrew Beard. Steve dealing mainly with visitors bookings / payments etc & Andrew overseeing moorings (positioning etc), contact details are shown in the header.

The Trust owns the hatched area shown on the map below and it is mandatory that you observe the SAFETY PRECAUTIONS within the Trust's area of ownership. Other area's of the beach and the sea inside the line of the speed buoys are administered by the Parish and Bourough Councils with the same madatory safety precautions. While the councils administer their area's of the beach, it should be noted that both the Parish and Bourough Councils have given their authorisation for the Trust's Joint Harbourmasters to act on their behalf in the event of any dangerous and / or unacceptable behaviour on the Council owned part of the beach.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS:

- All operators and their craft must carry a minimum of Third Party Insurance
- Keep strictly to the maximum speed limit of <u>5mph</u> inside the speed buoys as shown on the map.
- Navigate with great care in the harbour and within the buoyed area where there are swimmers
- Operators of <u>water ski</u> and all <u>other powered craft</u> must take extra care and keep a sharp lookout for swimmers, small craft, inflatables, fishermen working their gear, etc
- Water skiers must keep well to the seaward side of the speed buoys.
- Every boat including all gear and equipment, operates, and is left within the harbour area entirely at the owners risk. GHHT accepts no resposibility for the safety of any person, boat equipment, or other property while within the Trust's premises.
- Between 10am and 6pm powered craft must only access the beach via the prescribed channel
- No boat shall be left in the harbour without being properly secured, with a minmum of 3 adequate fenders positioned on each side of the vessel.
- o Protruding outboard propellers must be protected
- Boats moored on the Trust's warps must be positioned midships to midships and secured both bow and stern
- Boats without moorings must only be anchored to the seaward side of the yellow buoys.
